KUKISTUDENT EXCHANGE 2019

Roseburg students and their families hosted 18 students and 4 chaperones July 23rd - August 1st. In addition, Mayor Umeda and five other city officials arrived in Roseburg on July 29th and traveled home with the student group. We had a busy schedule packing in a lot of fun local activities. The weather was perfect, the best in many years for a visit.

Our group carpooled to Eugene to pick up the students. We returned to Roseburg and our weary travelers went home with their host families, taking with them the schedule booklet and team shirts.

We kept things close to home on Wednesday.





The group visited the Safety Center, seeing both the police and fire stations. А highlight was seeing the rescue dog in action. We also visited city hall, in the council chamber with a couple of council members. From there, we walked

to the courthouse lawn for lunch. Mercy put together wonderful boxed lunches for our group.

We took a short walk around downtown and then went to Create and Sip Studio. The students painted a scene of Crater Lake for the next hour and a half. Next the group went to Ten Down where they bowled for an hour with the fun lighting and music.



Our traditional Welcome Dinner was on Wednesday evening at the party barn at the CH Bailey House in Dixonville. There was a wonderful potluck dinner which featured pulled pork



sandwiches. Part of the tradition is speeches by both chaperones and students. We heard from Mr. Uchiyama, a junior high principal. Roseburg students, Olivia and Savannah,

delivered brief speeches. We then heard a nice speech by Chizuru, who spoke in English:



impressive! The evening continued with students doing interactive games organized by former member Margo Boyd. This was a wonderful evening for all

involved.

Thursday took us to Glide, as half of our Team is from the Glide area. We started out at Glide High School with some cookie baking and rides in beautiful old cars. The group then did a short hike on the North Umpqua Trail to Deadline Falls.



Lunch was served next to the old mill pond at the Blodgett's house.



Afterwards, the students fished and paddled kayaks on the pond, as well as enjoying lawn games or just some relaxing. The next venue was further up Little River to the Bucich family home. Here the students cooled off with swimming in their great



swimming hole. There was also a BBQ dinner for the students and families. We were so lucky to be in such beautiful locations.

Friday, the city of Bandon was our destination! With our group being so large, we made three groups, rotating between activities which included lunch at Bandon Brewing, shopping, and crabbing

in the bay. Surprisingly, the group caught more than 60 crabs! On the beach at the jetty, we were lucky enough to see two whales very close. While the students played, a few parents cooked the crabs. Everyone then joined in for an impromptu crab feed. Time in Bandon ended with ice cream at Face Rock Creamery.



The weekend was up to the families; from what I heard, many wonderful experiences happened.

Monday had us traveling to Grants Pass for a jet boat trip at Hellgate Excursions. The smoke was prevalent due to the south county fire, but it did not dampen our spirits.



Our trip included lunch at the lodge. I asked our boat driver for "extra wet" on the way back. He did not disappoint. As usual, everyone seemed to have a blast on the boats!

Tuesday was our second Roseburg day. We began at Wildlife Safari. The entire group got on the bus and took the full drive-through tour. It was a cool morning, so the animals were active. We had a short time in the village before we split into two groups. One group saw the elephants, while the other saw the giraffes. We ventured up the freeway to the Roseburg Rod and Gun Club where we had lunch that Marliene Swanson and other RSC members put on a great Frito pie lunch for us.

20 Japanese middle school students and their chaperones from Kuki City were joined by their host homestay students for a Frito Pie lunch at the Rod and Gun Club July 30th. The menu also included steamed rice, Oreo cookies, watermelon, and flavored bottled water. Colorful balloons and checkered tablecloths decorated the tables. The Frito pies were very popular, as was the rice. Based on the fact that there were no leftovers, we think our menu choices were right on!

Joanie Chambers and Marliene Swanson co-chaired the event. Others providing valuable help were Beverly Cole, Linda Fisher, Joann Pico, Maureen William, Akiyo Riggs and Nancy Pittman. To honor the Mayor's visit, we provided a Welcome Dinner at TRUE Kitchen & Bar in Roseburg on Monday, June 29, 2019.



In attendance were the Mayor's group – Kuki City Mayor, Shuichi Umeda; Kuki City Council Chairman, Akihiro Kamijo; Kuki City Council Member, Kenichiro Hirasawa; Head of Citizen Life Section of Kuki City,

Tatsuya Ichikawa; Kuki City Secretary Manager, Masahide Hidaka; and Interpreter/Middle School Exchange Advisor, Danny Blivens.

Mr. Hirasawa, City Council Member, and his family will be hosting two of our 2019 Delegation members in October – Jeneen Hartley and Emily Brandt.

Dr. Thatcher restated the agreement that Umpgua Community College has had in place for many years: that any students from Kuki City who attend Umpqua Community College are eligible for "IN-STATE" Tuition. Dustin Cosby, the UCC Enrollment Advisor, has been working with Kuki City in hopes that there will be students coming from Kuki City to Umpqua Community College in the future and gave the Mayor and his group a tour of the Umpqua Community College campus the day after the Welcome Dinner.



Since January 16, 2018 we have had our storage with the City of Roseburg Library after Wells Fargo Bank closed their downtown branch where our previous long-time storage was located.





August 28th the RSC Book Club met to discuss



Volunteers should bring gloves, sun hat, water


bottle and any favorite garden tool they might have. Tools and wheelbarrows will be available.
